unqle play uncle play is the story of unqle and fave, both gay, one sober, one not, one dying, one not, one cis, one not, navigating their relationship, their history, and their shared legacy within the context of one epic last conversation. It is a 90-minute negotiation of terms of what it means to tell someone's story, how much we can ask of those who leave us, and what it means to say goodbye.

Bear witness to a moment of history as two loving combatants spar through generational ideas of queer liberation using drag, Sondheim, and Catholicism in this highly theatrical exploration of love, grief, and the shifting values of the queer community.

Classes taught: Intro to Playwriting, Playwriting Workshop, Script Analysis

- → Maintain a supportive, encouraging learning environment in which students feel equipped to take risks without focusing on product. There is no good or bad, there is only inspiration and intention, and I consider it my job to help students most clearly tell their stories in the way that feels right to them.
- → Foster discussion that focuses on interrogating a playwright's intention; what play were they trying to write, what play did they write? What stuck with us? What questions are we left with?
- → Acknowledge that creating art is a vulnerable task, and honor that every time we share our work.
- → Solicit submissions for and help organize the 'undergrad shorts' night of new plays by undergrad writers, which takes place during IU's At First Sight Festival of New Works.

PLAYWRIGHT-IN-RESIDENCE, NEW VOICES FOR THE THEATRE, SPARC June 2022

- → Read, evaluate, and help select plays to be produced as part of the New Voices program, making it a priority to create a group of plays and playwrights that offer a variety of experiences, backgrounds, voices, and goals.
- → Plan and facilitate a two week intensive playwriting workshop for the selected playwrights (ages 15-18), covering the basics of playwriting structure and rewriting, workshopping their plays within the small cohort, and offering exercises to sharpen and strengthen their plays prior to a rehearsal process.
- → Act as support for the playwrights as they move into a rehearsal process, assisting them as they navigate their role in the room and their relationship with their director, actors, and production team.
